

Football Fans to be Celebrated at Appreciation Party



Cooking Up Community: A Year In Review at Our Lodge

As another Elk year approaches, our lodge stands on the foundation of a calendar year filled with celebration, service, and heartfelt connection. Though our official year doesn't begin until April 1, the story of what our members accomplished over the past twelve months deserves a spotlight of its own. From record-breaking events to community outreach, from honoring traditions to embracing new ideas, 2025 at the Santa Ana Elks Lodge was a year defined by the very spirit of Elkdom: fellowship, charity, and community.

A January That Set The Pace

The year began with a familiar mix of festivity and purpose. After ringing in the New Year, members jumped right back into the action with the Emblem Club's lively parcel post event. PER Allen Bisbee's mystery-prize auction brought big laughs and bigger surprises, while DJ Ronnie helped launch the annual backpack project's first fundraiser of the season.

January also delivered the largest Super Bowl gathering in Orange County, as more than 500 fans filled the lodge for a day of football, food, and camaraderie. It was clear from the start: this would be a year of impressive participation and community pride.

February: Love, Leadership and Service

February marked the unveiling of our beautiful new memorial garden—an inviting space dedicated to the memory of departed members. Elections brought in our new exalted ruler, Mark Schauwecker, and his officer team, following two months of initiation ceremonies led by our past exalted rulers.

A brand-new online ticketing system streamlined event reservations, debuting just in time for a Friday Valentine's Day celebration filled with romance. Meanwhile, veterans committee chair Kellie Miller and her team played a crucial role at the second annual Orange Coast District Stand Down, supporting nearly 200 veterans in need.

March: Music, Madness and Mullets

March arrived with the frenzied fun of college basketball brackets filling the Nest. General Manager John Moore launched an exciting tribute concert series, bringing the sounds of Elton John, Journey, and Chicago to enthusiastic crowds.

The lodge's Irish spirit took center stage at the St. Patrick's Day celebration hosted by Loyal Knight Brian Byrd, whose face graced the *ElkHorn* cover that month. The Fenians headlined the sold-out celebration, while a separate '80s-themed fundraiser revived big hair, neon fashion, and a shared mission: raising scholarship funds. In March alone, the scholarship commit-

tee awarded more than \$60,000 in scholarship support.

April: A New Elk Year Begins

April ushered in new leadership with the installation of officers and the April 5 inaugural ball. Exalted Ruler Mark introduced his motto, “*Cooking Up Community*,” setting the tone for the year’s charitable and social direction. One of the most exciting advancements arrived as well—our brand-new Elks App, designed to bring lodge communication into a modern era.

May: Achievements at Every Level

May was a milestone month. With the CHEA state convention in Anaheim, members across our district joined forces to help host. Our lodge performed impressively at the district ritual competition, taking second place overall and earning several individual honors—led by Inner Guard Cathy Pouchie’s first-place finish.

In addition, Carmen DiAnda was recognized as the district’s best candidate and in the eleven o’clock toast competition, PER Dan Breece proudly took 1st place.

The month brought another major highlight: Scott Stephens of the Fullerton Lodge was announced as the upcoming California-Hawaii Elks Association president.

Our own lodge shined as well, with Secretary Linda Fernandez earning CHEA Secretary of the

Year and the *ElkHorn* winning Best Newsletter across both California and Hawaii.

Wednesday Night Trivia introduced its first-ever Tournament of Champions, and our members honored the fallen by placing more than 900 flags on veteran gravesites for Memorial Day.

June: A Tribute in Motion

June unfolded at a gentler pace, but with deep meaning. The Monday Night Football golf tournament was renamed in honor of the late Bob Woolford, a Navy veteran, passionate golfer and steadfast volunteer. The renaming reflected the gratitude of a lodge profoundly touched by his dedicated service.

July: Summer Celebrations and Championships

The tilers brought summer spirit to life at the annual 4th of July celebration, offering family-friendly fun for all ages. The MNF committee ventured into new territory with its first saltwater fishing trip, taking 25 anglers out to sea.

Our lodge baseball team pulled off an impressive run, battling through the loser’s bracket to secure a second straight championship. And after careful planning and member input, we unveiled our brand-new lodge pin, a symbol of pride for visitors and home members alike.

August: Cars, Cakes and Community Pride
