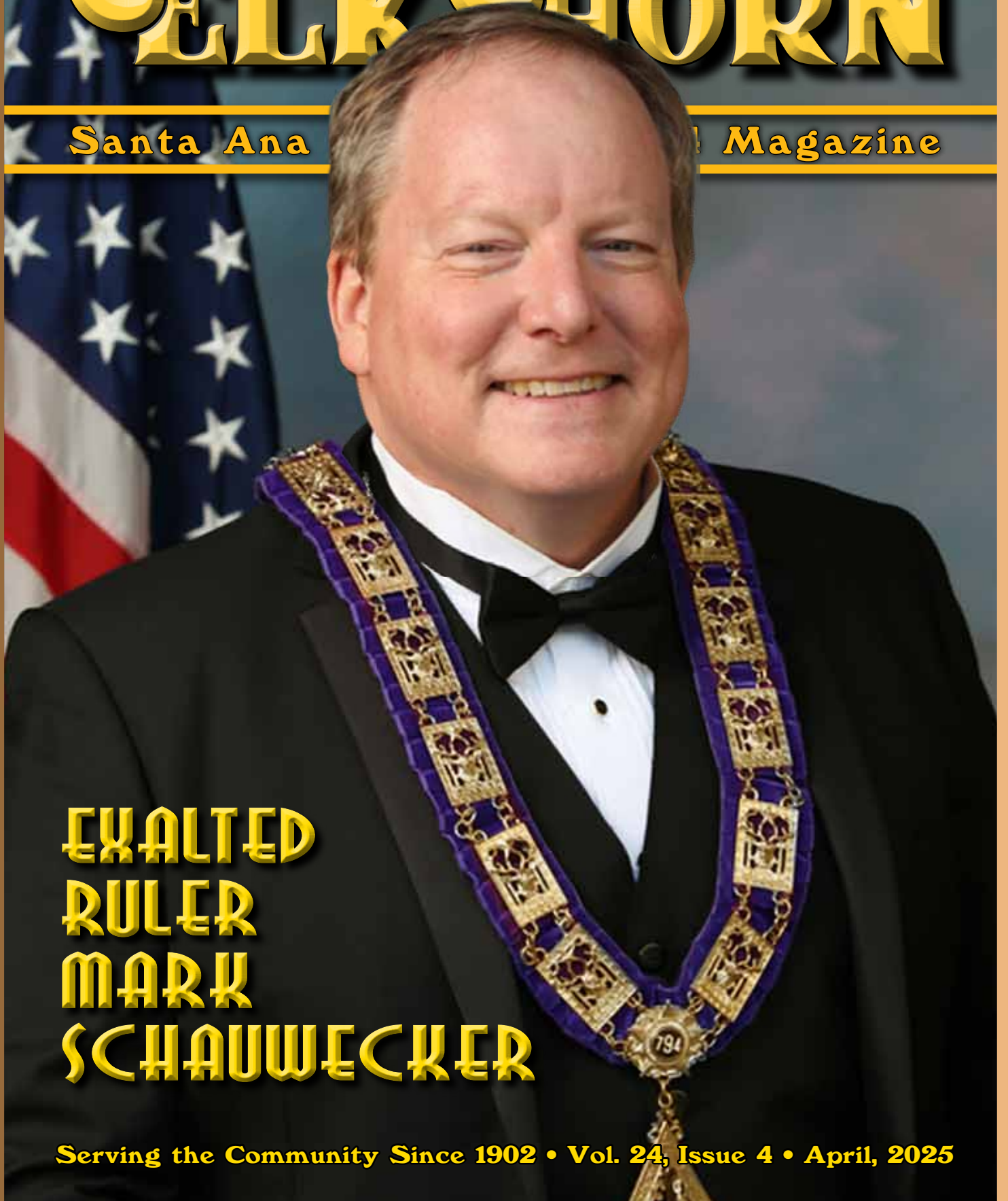



Employee Corner

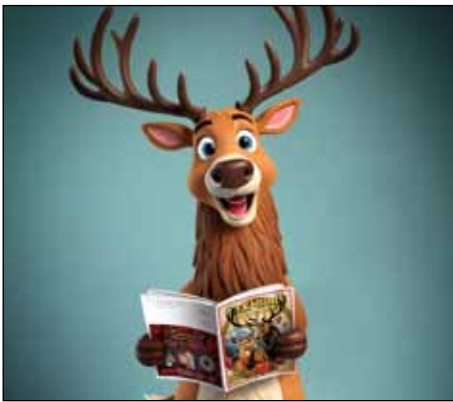

MNF: More Than Just Football!

MNF, as most of you know, is Monday Night Football. We have a tremendous group of members who volunteer for that committee and provide a lot of fun and good times while working hard to make sure when you attend a Monday night game, our golf tournament or car show, that you leave wanting to come back.

This month, while there is the NCAA men's and women's basketball championship games on the first weekend, I wanted to share with you how much more the MNF committee is doing and how what we do helps kids in our community.

Three years ago, our committee came up with the idea about sponsoring a student-athlete scholarship. The end result was last month, we funded 11 scholarships for \$15,000. Partnering with the scholarship committee, who donated extra funds they had, in total, we gave out 27 scholarships for a total of \$31,000. All thanks to you for supporting what we do.

Our scholarship criteria is a little different though. We require the applicant to write an essay on what and/or how being an athlete and/or athletics has impacted their lives. Describe what obstacles or adversity

they overcame from lessons they learned being an athlete and part of a team. The essay is 80% of their score. The other 20% comes from letters of recommendation from their coaches, counselors or teachers. Unique for sure. Their stories even more so.

These high school kids, from all backgrounds, share very personal stories at times. Each year we read essays that describe overcoming learning disabilities, physical injuries both on and off the field or court. They include family health challenges, death and homelessness. They are first generation kids who are attending a high school in America for the first time and must learn English, make friends, and fit in. These examples are just a small sample of the kind of student athletes we have in our community. The kind of kids we have in our community that have shown courage, character, perseverance, and grit, to achieve success in the classroom and on the field or court. Based on the essays we have read the past three years, it's safe to say our future is in pretty good hands.

On behalf of all these student-athletes who applied for or received a scholarship from us, we say thank you for supporting what we do. It means more than you know!

Introducing our new Exalted Ruler, Mark Schauwecker

Mark shared that his first event hosting as an officer was the 2023, Oktoberfest. He has a little bit of German heritage in his family tree, and he always loved attending an Oktoberfest. Sure enough, the man was correct. Having never seen this guy at the lodge, it turns out it was Paul G. Shelor III, who now resides in Michigan and makes an occasional visit.

When you're at the lodge for an event or function or just for lunch or dinner, if you see Mark, don't be shy to introduce yourself. He looks forward to meeting as many members as possible this year. His heart is in the right place for us as members and for our lodge. We're in good hands for 2025-2026.

Elks Award \$61,000 in Scholarships

What an exciting night for our students receiving scholarships and for our 794 Elks Lodge! On March 4, we presented 40 awards to 39 students totaling \$61,000! That is a record for our lodge and the culmination of a year of fund raising and promoting our scholarships.

We were so very pleased to see the room packed with students, their families and supporters as well as so many of our lodge members there to support and wish our students well. Every year we do this, we make some difficult decisions on who will receive the awards and every year it gets harder as the students applying become more and more impressive in their endeavors and achievements.

We awarded 27 athletic scholarships. This is the 3rd year we have offered this scholarship, an idea that was brought to us by the Monday Night Football committee, and we have increased the number dramatically each year. It is partially funded by the MNF and partially by our committee funds and we had so many very qualified applicants, we couldn't resist making extra funds available for them.

We also awarded the last of the

Lenz scholarships and will be retiring it this year. The Lenz family created an endowment many years ago with the instruction that the funds be disbursed to Elks members or their families. Pursuant to their instructions and completing their legacy wish, the last award was given this year to Marissa Hayes, granddaughter of Judy Brandelise.

We awarded our first ever Opportunity Scholarship, designed for students attending community college. That scholarship was awarded to Isaac Estrada who intends to move on from Orange Coast College to UC Santa Barbara in 2026.

We are so very proud to present to you the following Most Valuable Student winners that have moved on past our district competition to winning state competition. They are Gerardo Caravez of Valley High School, Jenelle Huerta of Legacy Magnet Academy, Thein-Tho Nguyen of Foothill High School, and Matthew Hsieh of Legacy Magnet Academy. And finally, Isabella Lugo of Foothill High School has moved on in judging for the Elk's National Foundation award which puts her in competition with students across the country for \$30,000 in scholarships!

The scholarship committee is proud of our winners and you should be, too! They are a diverse group of students who have excelled in many fields and will continue to do so. We as a committee, are very glad we could help them pursue their educational dreams.

Our committee has also put in a great deal of effort and raised a record amount of funds this past year, and we are getting better at the task all the time. On March 29 we held our biggest event ever, the Forever Young '80s-themed dinner dance. But since I don't have a DeLorean and can't go *Back to the Future*, I'm going to wait and tell you play by play how that rad "excellent adventure" went down next month!

By raising awareness of our work at the various activities of the lodge, we have received very generous donations from our lodge members for scholarships which we so appreciate. Patrick Kuykendall was exalted ruler for the 2016-2017 Elk year. Patrick grew up in Santa Ana, going to Glen Martin Elementary School and Saddleback High School. His dad, Tom, was a long-time Elk mem-

With this new year also comes the anticipation of new grants – What can we do differently? Who else can we help? Are there new veteran programs and collaborations that we can be involved with.

The veterans committee will continue to give out welcome home kits, play Bingo at the Long Beach VA, give free lunches to needy veterans at homes and the VA. We will help and contribute wherever and to whomever we can.

We will be sponsoring two veterans on a two day fishing trip, out of San Diego. This is an all-expense paid experience, and we'd love to sponsor veterans from the Santa Ana lodge. A lot happened in March: March 1 was the 2nd annual veterans Stand Down in Garden Grove and all eight lodges in our South Coast District were involved in putting this together! We had over 200 veterans that showed up for dental work, new eyeglasses, hot meals, clothing, camaraderie and a lot of other resources to help them get back on

their feet. As a veteran, I also visited the VA table to make sure I was up to date on the benefits that are available to me. (I've never looked into this, I always thought I'd figure it out and handle it on my own. Sadly, I'm not the only one that thinks like that) Not all veterans know where and how to get help. This is extremely important for those that need to submit a claim, get help to find a place to sleep, a new job.. It was a successful day and thank you to everyone who helped in any capacity.



The veterans committee finished three grants this month – Freedom, Spotlight and the Focus Grant.

The Freedom Grant (\$1,000) was used to buy shelving and food to start a food pantry at Heroes Landing. This helps the veterans that are currently living there but also valuable to the ones that just moved in that don't have food or anything with them.

The Spotlight Grant (\$2,000) was used for the veterans Stand Down – It was used to buy men and women's hygiene packs, hair brushes, toothpaste, toothbrushes, chil-

dren's clothing, undergarments for women and other items that homeless, needy or unstably housed veterans need for themselves and their families.

The Focus Grant (\$10,000) was used for Patriots and Paws. The first portion was for Thanksgiving meals and we provided 80 bags of food which included everything needed to prepare a meal for themselves, friends and family (stuffing, cranberries, mashed potatoes, gravy, vegetables, yams, chicken broth, brownies.) We also gave out 96 frozen turkeys!

The second part of this grant was used for families who are just moving into their new home. Thirty kitchen kits were put together and given out for a family of four (dish sets, pots/pans, serving utensils, silverware sets, glasses, toasters, microwaves.)

It's such a heartwarming experience to hand these out to people that really need them. Patriots and Paws helps both veterans and active-duty men and women. It's an honor to meet with them and thank them for defending our country.

The veterans committee continues to strive in hopes of being the support to those that need help at this point of their lives. Whether it be food, helping to move to new housing, fixing their vehicle to get to work, finding clothing, laughing or listening, we're here to help.
