
FELIZ NAVIDAD SOTO CONCERT

We're still reaching out to the schools and the students in our service area and even helping with their applications.

The Most Valuable Student applications were the first to be due in November. With this scholarship, the applicants have a chance to compete at the district, state and even national level of our Elks organization. Those applications go

directly to ENF and we will be notified by our district any day now how many applications we will have to judge this year. District judging for the Most Valuable Student will take place in the second week of January and will be hosted by our lodge.

The Bob McCalla Scholarship is a memorial legacy scholarship honoring Bob McCalla and his contributions to our lodge. The scholarship administrator for the family has very generously decided to increase the awards to a minimum of four \$2,500 college scholarships this year. In addition, they have decided to offer a \$2,500 scholarship dedicated to applicants pursuing a career in nursing! Ap-

plications for both are due on January 9, 2026.

New this year is another memorial scholarship, the Machado Family Scholarships, in memory of Bob Machado who was deeply involved in our community and the education of young people. 
Santa Ana Hoop Shoot Scores Big






