# PRESIDENTS' DAY

## ELKS AND THE OVAL OFFICE

### Leadership Service and the Fraternal Ideal

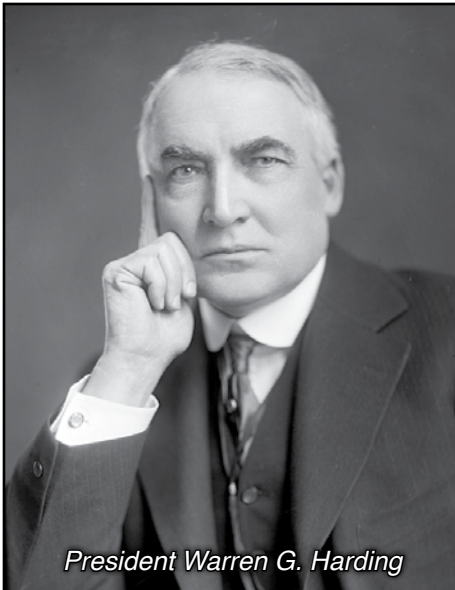
**P**resident's Day invites Americans to reflect not only on those who have held the nation's highest office, but on the values that define true leadership. For members of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, the holiday resonates in a particular way. The ideals of fraternity, service and devotion to country—long practiced in Elks lodges—are the same principles that have guided some of the nation's most respected presidents.

The holiday now known as Presidents' Day began as a tribute to George Washington, whose birthday, February 22, was widely observed in the decades following his death in 1799. Early celebrations included public speeches, parades and civic gatherings that honored Washington, not only as the nation's first president, but as a model of selfless leadership and republican virtue.

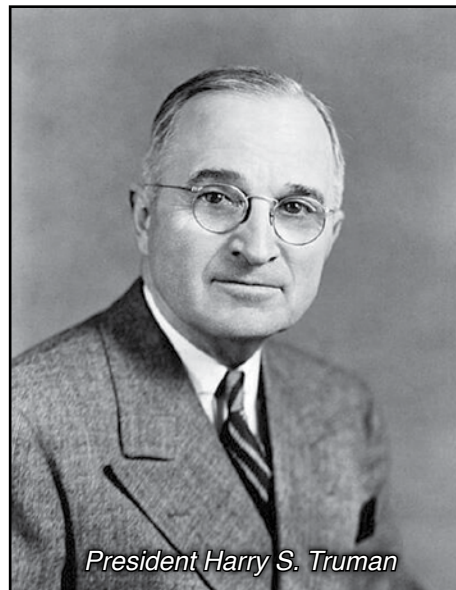
In 1879, Washington's Birthday became

a federal holiday, initially applying to the District of Columbia, and by 1955 it was extended nationwide—the first federal holiday to honor an individual American citizen. For nearly a century, the observance remained tied to Washington's actual birth date.

Change came with the Uniform Monday Holiday Act of 1968, which took effect in 1971 and moved the celebration to the third Monday of February. Although Congress never officially renamed the holiday, popular usage gradually expanded its meaning to honor not only Washington, but all who have served as President of the United States, with particular recognition given to Abraham Lincoln, whose birthday falls on February 12. Today, Presidents' Day stands as both a commemoration of individual leaders and a broader reflection on the responsibilities of the office itself.

### **WARREN G. HARDING** **29th President of the United States**

Warren G. Harding is the only U.S. President known to have been an active member of the Elks prior to assuming office. Initiated into Marion Lodge No. 32 in Ohio, Harding believed deeply in the power of fraternal organizations to strengthen communities and promote national unity.

Harding often spoke of the bond formed through shared service. In a 1921 address, he reflected “There is a fraternity among men who serve, which cannot be written into law, but which is essential to the spirit of America.”

His presidency emphasized reconciliation and stability in the aftermath of World War I—goals that mirrored the Elk’s commitment to harmony, patriotism and service to others

### **HARRY S. TRUMAN** **33rd President of the United States**

Harry S. Truman, a member of Independence Lodge No. 204 in

Missouri, brought a similarly grounded perspective to public service. Known for his plain-spoken honesty and unwavering sense of duty, Truman valued local institutions and fraternal organizations as the backbone of American democracy.

His philosophy of leadership aligned closely with Elks principles of humility and unselfish service. Truman once observed: “It is amazing what you can accomplish if you do not care who gets the credit.”

That belief was evident through his presidency which demanded difficult decisions made not for personal acclaim, but for the good of the nation.

### **DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER** **34th President of the United States**

While not a regular member, Dwight D. Eisenhower was named an honorary member of the Order of Elks, recognizing a lifetime devoted to service. As Supreme Allied Commander

during World War II and later as President, Eisenhower exemplified steady leadership, restraint and devotion to democratic ideals.

The honorary distinction reflected the shared values between the Order and a leader whose life demonstrated that leadership is rooted in service, not in privilege.

### **A PRESIDENTS’ DAY REFLECTION**

President’s day is ultimately about more than birthdays or titles. It is a moment to reflect on the character and commitments that sustain the republic. The connection between the presidency and the Elks remind us that leadership begins in communities—through fellowship, responsibility and service to others,

From lodge rooms to the Oval Office, the enduring lesson is clear: a strong nation is built by individuals who serve without seeking reward. That principle lies at the heart of both President’s Day and the proud traditions of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks.



## The Super Bowl: From a Modest Kickoff to America's Biggest Sunday

When the first Super Bowl was played in January 1967, few could have predicted it would become the most-watched annual sporting event in American life. Then known simply as the AFL-NFL World Championship Game, Super Bowl I was a practical solution to a rivalry between two leagues. Played before a crowd that didn't even fill the stadium, it was more curiosity than spectacle.

Everything changed as professional football grew into a national obsession. The merger of the AFL and NFL in 1970 cemented the Super Bowl as the season's grand finale, and television transformed it into a cultural event. By the 1980s, and '90s, the game had become as famous for its commercials and halftime shows as for its championship drama. Roman numerals, iconic moments, legendary dynasties and unforgettable upsets turned the Super Bowl into a shared national ritual—one Sunday each year when living rooms, bars and lodges all tune in together.

Today the Super Bowl is more than a game. It's a celebration of community, tradition and

togetherness—values that pair naturally with Elks lodges across the country. Locally, that spirit reaches its peak at the Santa Ana Elks Super Bowl Party. Known as the largest Super Bowl gathering in Orange County, it brings members, families and friends together for football, food and fellowship on the biggest Sunday of the year.

Here at the Santa Ana Elks Lodge, hundreds of football fans will converge to watch the game on multiple giant screens while enjoying BBQ burgers, BBQ chicken, nachos, boneless wings, hot dogs, cookies and, of course, plenty of delicious libations. Early Bird tickets are \$35 available online at [SAElks.com](http://SAElks.com) as well as at the lodge all throughout the month of January. Starting February 1, tickets are \$40... if they're still available. This event always sells out so get your tickets early!
