Fiscal Responsibility

Fiscal Responsibility, simply put, means “managing our money wisely and not spending more than we bring in.” This month, let’s focus on one opportunity that is achievable. *The Elkhorn*, our award winning magazine. Printing and postage costs have increased significantly and much of that increase is beyond our control. What can we do to help offset those costs? I’m glad you asked!

Through our research, we found several households with multiple members rightfully receiving multiple copies. We know you both paid your dues, but unless you’re using that sec-

ond copy to perform emergency surgery on a wobbly chair, would you consider sharing one?

To our valued associate members, would you consider ditching the paper copy and reading *The Elkhorn* online instead? Making either switch is a massive help to the lodge budget.

Your participation would be greatly appreciated and you will be my favorite volunteer (don’t tell the others!). I want to emphasize that this is completely voluntary and only an opportunity for those who feel comfortable helping the lodge reduce expenses.

Going Solar

Next, let me shine a light on another incredibly important project, solar power. By the time you read this, our shiny new solar panels should be installed and actively capturing the sun’s energy to power the lodge. Your approval to go solar is going to do wonders for our budget.

Our initial estimates show that this system could slash our current electric bill by roughly 50% to 70%. It turns out that being fiscally responsible can actually be quite refreshing! To put that in perspective: during last

month's extreme heat, running the A/C constantly to keep everyone comfortable came with a massive price tag. While we will still have an electric bill, this solar project will allow us to take control of that expense and shrink it significantly.

More importantly, this is an investment in the future of Santa Ana Elks Lodge. Energy costs will continue to change, but we have taken a significant step toward minimizing their impact on our lodge. Kudos to those who participated—your vote and confidence in this project will soon begin paying dividends.

As you read in Eli's column, we are transitioning to solar power this month, a decision that was made after a year of research and

discussion. We selected National Energy Installers whose résumé includes Hoag Hospital and PayPal headquarters plus many other fortune 500 companies. As a nonprofit we qualified for many rebates to offset the initial cost, but the real benefit will be seen on our monthly Edison bill. Our average bill during the summer was \$22,000.00 the move to solar energy will cut that down dramatically. Thank you to the trustees for your forward thinking and making decisions for the betterment of the lodge for years to come.

If any of you want to investigate switching to solar energy, for your home or business or another lodge please let me know and I will put you in contact with a National Energy representative.

Another decision was made to apply a 3% usage fee on all credit card transactions. Most of you are unaware that the lodge pays close to \$75,000.00 annually in credit card fees. We must pass those fees on to the consumer to help balance our books. The way around the 3% fee is to use your debit card or pay cash (our ATM is in the McCalla Lounge). There are no fees on debit cards or cash.

"Thank you for calling the Santa Ana Elks Lodge!" You will be hearing that more often as we have replaced our old phones with 12 new AT&T phones to answer your calls and provide you with answers to your questions and help with reservations. I would like to recognize Andy Matthews, who assisted us behind the scenes helping with the transition from our old provider to AT&T we could not have done it without his assistance.

Most of our members prefer to purchase event tickets online at SAElks.com. It's easy, convenient

and open 24 hours a day. But for those who wish to stop by the lodge and have a team member make their reservation for them, our front desk team is always happy to assist and accept cash and check transactions.

Don't Wait! Apply for Scholarships Now.

If you attended the scholarship information night last month, you are prepared to begin the scholarship application process. Don't hesitate to apply for more than one scholarship. Some of our past winners have been awarded at least two scholarships. As was mentioned at the presentation, in addition to those offered by the Elks, there are many other organizations that award students for their achievements. Researching scholarships online can be very insightful but be cautious about the legitimacy of what you may find. As we all know, scammers are out there.

If a student is planning to apply for the most valuable student scholarship (MVS), now is the time. The deadline is November 12. Applying at the last minute is not a good idea. It is not a simple application,

for it requires lists with explanations of community activities, academic honors, and extracurricular activities. The essay needs to show the student has given some thought to the subject and taken the time to write it from the heart, not just something that is rote. Judges put a lot of emphasis on the writing ability of applicants. A parent, grandparent, or family friend are sometimes useful as a second pair of eyes, but they must be sure the essay is truly the words of the student. The other necessity for any scholarship application is the letter of recommendation. Usually, at least two or three are required. Requests to the letter writers must allow ample time for the writing of the recommendation. A rushed recommendation letter never shows the full picture of the student.

In addition to the MVS scholarship, there are several other Elks sponsored scholarships at the national, state and local levels. All have been discussed in past *Elk Horn* articles. If there are extra packets from the information night, they will be available on the flyer table in the lobby. They will provide more needed information, especially for those unable to attend the meeting. Members of the scholarship committee are always available for questions.

As students are busy working on applications, the scholarship committee will be busy planning the decorations for the annual Oktoberfest, October 2. If you have not already purchased your tickets, it is a night you do not want to miss. The entertainment and food are terrific! I hope to see you there!

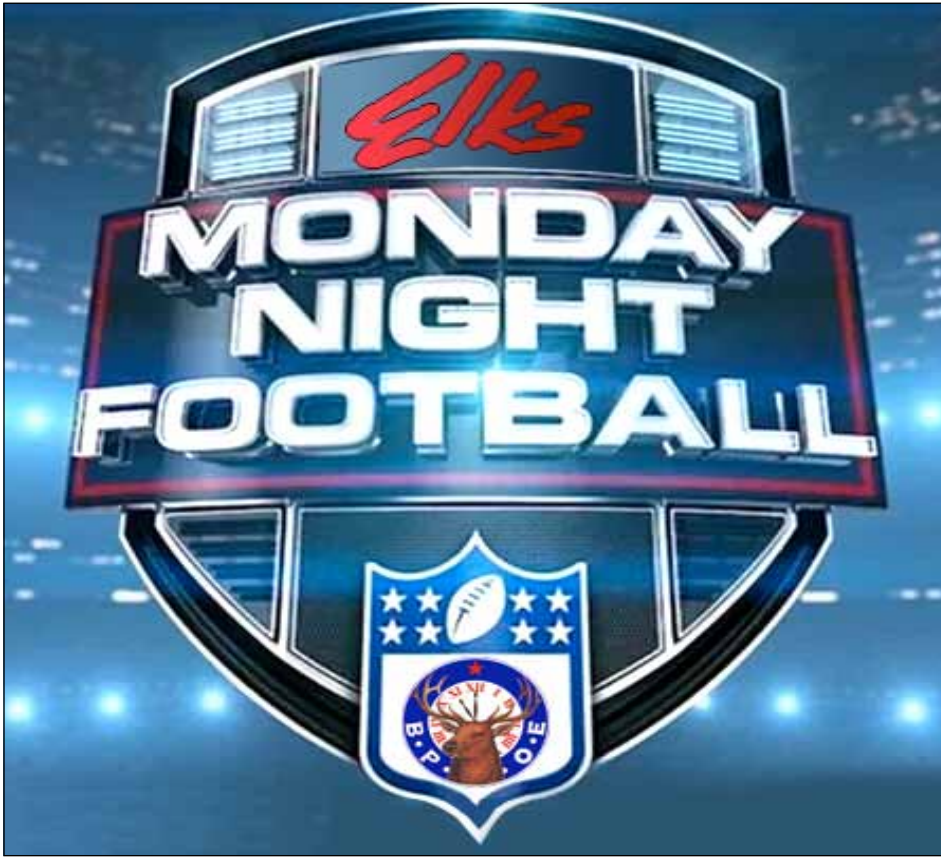
